- **25.** Praise God for the biblical and theological education happening among the Indigenous peoples of Ecuador. Pray that these ministries will deepen the faith of committed Christians and strengthen the unity of the body of Christ in the country.
- **26.** Terrorists continue to attack peaceful populations in Burkina Faso, as they work in their fields and worship in churches, placing the country first on the 2024 Global Terrorism Index. Mennonite leaders request prayer for an end to the violence and for healing for the thousands of people who have been traumatized by seeing loved ones murdered and who are, themselves, healing from injuries.
- **27.** Pray for Jack Sara president of Bethlehem Bible College in Palestine and the faculty, staff and students, as they continue their programs, despite the violence and suffering they experience daily. Pray for God's shalom, as they navigate the devastation around them. (p. 13)
- **28.** Today, Joseph and Rachel Givens continue a tradition of gathering the guests of the Maria Skobtsova House and the other houses of refuge around Calais, France, for a Thanksgiving meal. Pray that on this day, God's love will be shown, so that people fleeing violence may find community and people who are hungry may eat their fill. (p. 24)
- **29.** Robert Irundu, a leader in the Mennonite Church of Congo, requests prayers for an end to the war in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo. Pray for peace and strong faith, as some believers have lost their trust in God because of the atrocities they are experiencing.
- **30.** Kate Widmer works with the community outreach ministries of the Mennonite church in France. Pray for her as she works with women and children in the Muslim neighborhood where she lives, running a sewing class, a group for girls, a group for mothers, afternoon activities, and helping with the church's café and bookstore. - **2.** JCS International, Mongolia, is preparing the 2025 budget. Pray that God and God's people will provide the necessary resources. Pray also for the JCS board meetings that are scheduled for this month. (p. 20)
- **3.** Mennonite Bible School, in South Africa, is preparing for graduations at all five of their local branches this month. Pray that the ceremonies will increase interest in the study of God's word, and pray for God's anointing on the graduates, as they follow God's leading in their ministries. (p. 13)
- **4.** Praise God for the work of Naomi Leary, former regional director for North America, who has moved on to another ministry opportunity. Pray for Lori Hershberger Blair, Ana Alicia Hinojosa, Alex Mace, Eric Frey Martin and Andrew Suderman, who are sharing responsibilities for the smooth functioning of Mennonite Voluntary Service and Service Adventure, while the search for a new regional director is ongoing.
