- **21.** After participating in the Mennonite Women USA's Sister Care workshop in Brazil, Brazilian women organized a team to take this ministry to all the regions of Brazil. Pray for them in the coming year, as they further develop the Sister Care concept to include additional workshops on themes that the women have requested and as they prepare teams in each region to carry on these ministries.
- **22.** The Odessa Theological Seminary, a Mission Network partner in Ukraine, is adapting its curriculum to the changing needs of a society traumatized by a prolonged war. Pray for the students, who are immediately putting into practice what they learn in their courses about Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and crisis counseling, as they share the healing love of Christ.
- **23.** Mission workers who have spent years in a media ministry in the Middle East ask us to pray that Christians will be protected, as they boldly share about the deliverance and abundant life that Jesus brings.
- **24.** Terrorists continue to attack peaceful populations in Burkina Faso, as the citizens work in their fields and worship in churches, placing the country at the top of the Global Terrorism Index. The Evangelical Mennonite Church of Burkina Faso leaders request prayer for an end to the violence and healing for the thousands of people who have been traumatized by seeing loved ones murdered. (p. 12)
- **25.** C. Paul and Hildi Amstutz have served in Paraguay since 1985. Pray for them as they transition to a less intensive ministry of doing and as they continue to lead spiritual retreats and serve as mentors. (p. 29)
- **26.** Pray for a family that has been engaged in a sensitive ministry of church planting in France since 2015. (p. 24)
- **27.** Laura Schlabach has a heavy workload, as she serves on JCS International's interim three-person executive director team. Pray that she will be able to create space for rest and renewal. (p. 17)
- **28.** Ramadan, a Muslim month of fasting, prayer, reflection and community, begins at sundown today. Pray for God's love, light and grace to shine on our Muslim neighbors and guide Muslim-Christian relationships around the world in ways that lead to peace.

Pray for the continuing outreach of the church's agencies in Hualien: the Mennonite Christian Hospital; the New Dawn Educare Center, which serves people with special challenges; and the Good Shepherd Center for abused women, those sold into prostitution, and children from dysfunctional families. (p.21)
- **2.** The Mennonite Voluntary Service in Alamosa, Colorado, has two members: Emily Keefer and Josh Kennell. Pray for them in their assignments related to restorative justice initiatives and for their host congregation, Anabaptist Fellowship of Alamosa, as they minister in some of Colorado's most vulnerable communities, addressing food and housing insecurity, immigrant justice, restorative justice, and working for the well-being of the natural environment. Pray that the churches in Ecuador will be strengthened, as they face many trials. (p. 29)
- **10.** Joseph and Rachel Givens accompany volunteers at the Maria Skobtsova House and wider community in Calais, France. Pray for them as they offer a temporary home to migrants, who are trying to cross the English Channel to find refuge in England. (p. 24)
- **11.** A couple, who has been serving through Youth With A Mission and other organizations in multiple Asian countries, requests prayer for their health and for better lives for their students in leadership training and business programs. (p. 16)
- **12.** SADRA Conflict Transformation is a Christian response to social injustice in southern Africa. Pray for director, Oscar Siwali, as he leads a team of trainers, who help communities, churches and schools deescalate violence from the individual level to the national level. (p. 13)
